Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of AMAZIN AUTOMATION SOLUTIONS INDIA PVT. LTD. ("the Company"), which comprise the balance sheet as at 31st March 2023, and the statement of Profit and Loss and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Act in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2023, and profit and its cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Opinion

Depreciation on tangible Assets is provided on written down method as per rates corresponding to useful life specified in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013 read with notification dated 29 August 2014 of the Ministry of Corporate Affairs.

Foreign Currency Transactions

Foreign exchange transactions are recorded at the exchange rates prevailing at the date of transaction. Provisions and Contingent Liabilities

A provision is recognised when it is more likely than not than an obligation will result in an outflow of resources. Provisions are not discounted to A disclosure for a contingent liability is made where it is more likely than not that a present obligation or possible obligation would not result in or involve an outflow of resources

The present value of the gratuity obligation is determined based on an actuarial valuation, using the Projected Unit Credit Method. Actuarial gains and losses arising on such valuation are recognized immediately in the Statement of Profit and Loss
